## **Greetings from Pastor Doug**

Once again, we are entering the Lenten season. Lent is the 40-day period between Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday. Hopefully it is a time that we set aside to remember and reflect on what Jesus did for all of us. This six-week period is usually a time of self-examination to see how we can become more Christ-like in everything we do.

This year we will be using Susan Robb's book *Seven Words – Listening to Christ fro m the Cross* for our Lenten study. We will be looking to see what all four of the gospel writers recorded.

These are the scriptures we will be looking at over the four weeks of our study:

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Matthew 27: 4 6, Mark 15:34

"Father, forgive them: for they do not know what they are doing." Luke 23:34

"Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise." Luke 23: 43

"Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Luke 23: 46

"Woman, here is your son...Here is your mother." John 19: 26-27

"I am thirsty." John 19:28

"It is finished" John 19:30

I have had the honor and privilege to hold the hands of people in their last moments. I have heard some of the last words shared with family members. These words are often the most honest and meaningful words spoken. So why did these gospel writers choose to share the words that Jesus spoke while on the cross?

Join us as we examine the seven last phrases from Christ on the cross, and discover what Jesus most wants us to hear.

## Elders & Deacons — Nominating Committee & Officer Elections

The Nominating Committee continues to meet and prayerfully discern God's call for the correct people to fill the leadership positions of Elder and Deacon still available. This is an important committee because these are folks we charge with the spiritual leadership of our church. So please join with the committee in praying and asking for guidance to the correct people to lead us as a congregation.

Here is how our Book of Order defines a Ruling Elder -

"As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with ministers of word and sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships."

And our Book of Order says deacons are to be, "persons of spiritual character." They should be persons of deep faith and high moral standards (see 1 Timothy 3:8–13), committed to a life of prayer, study and other spiritual disciplines.

Once the New Officers are nominated and approved by the Session and congregation they will be ordained and/or installed on Sunday, March 10th at both services.

Please join us in praying for this process.

#### FINANCE REPORT

#### FINANCE REPORT

The Church recorded a surplus from operations of \$22,700 for the year ended December 31, 2023 compared to a break-even budget. General Giving tithes & offerings were \$4,600 greater than anticipated, while total operating expenses were approximately \$14,000 less than budget. More information on these figures for 2023, as well as the 2024 Operating budget, will be provided at the February 25, 2024 Annual Congregational Meeting. Please try to attend.

## Restr i cted Fund Giving

SMPC greatly appreciates all your generous tithes and offerings throughout the year. When you indicate "current expenses" on your giving envelope (or make no indication at all), that designation is most helpful to the Church because it allows those monies to be utilized in the areas of greatest need.

However, if there is an occasion when you would like to donate to a specific cause above and beyond your normal level of giving, these are the following restricted funds that are available to you. Simply indicate the name of the restricted fund on your giving envelope on the line entitled "other" or in the memo section of your check.

**Youth Ministry** – these funds will be used to subsidize any operating costs of Youth Ministry, including Youth Director salaries. The monies cannot be used for expenses associated with the Youth House, such as utilities, repairs and maintenance, or building improvements."

**Per Capita** – these funds are used to support the Beaver-Butler Presbytery and are not required by either SMPC or the Presbytery. All monies donated to this Fund are transferred by the Church to the Presbytery for their use.

**Deacons** – these funds will be used to subsidize any operating costs connected with the day-to-day activities associated with the Deacons Ministry, including but not limited to Helping Hands.

**Mission Special Trip** – these funds will be used to support any special mission-related trip planned and approved by the Missions Committee.

**Building Fund** – The Building Fund is currently synonymous with the "Resurrect the Ark" capital campaign and will remain so until our goal of \$40,000 is obtained, or through September 2024, whichever comes first. More specifically, the monies will be used for improvements to the former Manse, Roebling House, Main Church, Trailer and parking lot.

Organ Fund – these funds will be used toward the eventual replacement of the Church's existing organ, or for the major repair and replacement parts of a future new organ. The monies will not be used for regular maintenance expenses such as tuning, voicing, etc.

**Friends of Music** – these funds will primarily be used to support a concert series hosted by SMPC. Specific types of costs include stipends to musicians/acts; production costs such as sound system & instruments; and venue acquisition such as Roebling Park. Occasionally, these monies could be used to purchase special equipment needs that support the concert series, such as kettle drums, music stands, etc.

**Vacation Bible School** – these funds will be used to subsidize any operating costs associated with the Annual Vacation Bible School, except for Children's Ministry Director salaries.
