Greetings from Pastor Doug Lent Bible Study

Sundays at 5 pm, Mar 16-Apr 6

In his new devotional, *From Wilderness to Glory:* Lent and Easter for Everyone, Norman T. Wright provides an opportunity for us to think, pray, and reflect through the stories of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. This study provides the opportunity to read a Bible story each day of the 40 days of the Lenten season. Wright relates the passages to our daily lives and leaves us with thought-provoking discussion questions.

Wright helps us to embrace that we're not going to always understand what is going on in a passage until we look deeper. He encourages us to "Look and learn to see and hear in it the heavenly vision, the heavenly voice.

Let them change you, mold you, make you somebody new, the person God wants you to be. Discover in the story the normally hidden heavenly dimension of God's world."

I would encourage everyone to take part in this Lenten journey. Call the church office to order this devotional.

You can read the daily passages on your own or with your family, and then I invite you to join us for our Lenten study starting on Sunday, March 16th and going through Sunday, April 6th at 5 p.m. Bring your favorite meal to share at the "Potluck Dinner" each evening.

Elders & Deacons — Nominating Committee & Officer Elections

The Nominating Committee continues to meet and prayerfully discern God's call for the correct people to fill the leadership positions of Elder and Deacon still available. This is an important committee because these are folks we charge with the spiritual leadership of our church. So please join with the committee in praying and asking for guidance to the correct people to lead us as a congregation.

Here is how our Book of Order defines a Ruling Elder -

"As there were in Old Testament times elders for the government of the people, so the New Testament church provided persons with particular gifts to share in discernment of God's Spirit and governance of God's people. Accordingly, congregations should elect persons of wisdom and maturity of faith, having demonstrated skills in leadership and being compassionate in spirit. Ruling elders are so named not because they "lord it over" the congregation (Matt. 20:25), but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God, and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life. Ruling elders, together with ministers of word and sacrament, exercise leadership, government, spiritual discernment, and discipline and have responsibilities for the life of a congregation as well as the whole church, including ecumenical relationships."

And our Book of Order says deacons are to be, "persons of spiritual character." They should be persons of deep faith and high moral standards (see 1 Timothy 3:8–13), committed to a life of prayer, study and other spiritual disciplines.

Once the New Officers are nominated and approved by the Session and congregation they will be ordained and/or installed on Sunday, March 2nd at both services.

Please join us in praying for this process.

FINANCE REPORT

FINANCE REPORT

The Church recorded a deficit from operations of \$46,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024 compared to a budget shortfall of \$49,000. General Giving tithes & offerings were \$19,000 less than anticipated, while total operating expenses were approximately \$3,000 less than budget. More information on these figures for 2024, as well as the 2025 Operating budget, will be provided at the February 23, 2025 Annual Congregational Meeting. Please try to attend.


